

# **Worship Group**

Hello and welcome to our first missive to the Messenger from the Worship group.

From the beginning of November to Easter is a very busy time within the Church and has been quite busy for the Worship group as well, looking forward to and celebrating the birth of Our Lord Jesus Christ. We have taken a number of services over the Christmas period out with the monthly Sunday service we manage. Alice organised the cake and carols service on the Friday before Christmas with about 60 people attending, a lovely service of readings and Christmas carols followed with people enjoying refreshments and on Christmas Eve we held the midnight mass service, though not as well attended as last year it was great to see locals and visitors alike.

Following the joint service with Canonbie on the last Sunday in December. January blessed us with Leoniek a Session Clerk from Canonbie leading one of the Sunday services. Hopefully this is something we will be able to support again later in the year.

We are now celebrating Epiphany and hearing some interesting reflections of this period from visiting Ministers. At the end of February, we enter our 40-day period of Lent leading up to the crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus. We have not yet decided what we will be looking to ask of ourselves and the congregation to 'give up' this year, 2 years ago it was clothes last year time. This year following the 'Random Act of Kindness' day supported throughout Carlisle in January, we have decided that we will be asking the Congregation (and beyond) to follow this through Lent. In Church there will be a poster where (unnamed) notices can be placed of random acts of kindness given or received each week. These could be as simple as carrying someone's shopping, giving a cake to a stranger, paying for a coffee for a person in a café. Buying a small bunch of flowers and then just giving a flower to anyone you pass. There can be so much pleasure for both parties the receiver and giver when a random act of kindness happens, and often it costs nothing more than your time.

We really appreciate the support and help we get from all of you and it is great to know that God is working in helping us bring more people to engage in the Church worship group services, and we look forward to hearing from Lorna when she will take our service in February.

We always welcome ideas for worship, different themes or styles, if you have any ideas please let us know and we will do what we can to incorporate and suggestions.

Our walk in faith is never easy, God never promised us an easy journey, but our worship and fellowship together makes the path more pleasant to walk each day, and remember if anything is troubling you: 'Cast your cares on the LORD and he will sustain you.' <u>Psalm 55:22 NIV</u>

And when we pray God is listening we can make it short and sweet as Matthew said 'When you pray, don't babble on and on.' Matthew 6:7 NLT
